On 12/09/07 at approximately 1040 hours I (Officer Rodriguez) was dispatched to 13401 West 58 Avenue in regards to a suspicious incident. Dispatch advised me while en route the RP at that address noticed footprints in the back yard of the residence and wanted an officer to respond to check the footprints.

Upon arrival I checked the footprints behind the house and discovered approximately five footprints that went from a tree at the north end of the residence that bordered a fence to another back yard at the north end of that residence. The backyard to the north of that residence was to a residence of 5906 Braun Way. I was unable to locate any footprints in that back yard. The footprints that went into the RP's backyard appeared to go east and stop at a bush. On the other end of the bush I was unable to tell if there were footprints as a dog had ran in that area and torn up the snow. The dog's footprints appeared to go to the east and then to an out building to the southeast of the location where the footprints had started. The footprints appeared to disappear in that area. I then contacted the RP again who identified herself as Sue Jackson. Sue advised me that she had noticed the footprints that morning when she woke up and stated that footprints had not been there the night before.

A short time later I went to 13463 West 58 Avenue, a residence directly to the south of the previous RP's address. I spoke with a male there who identified himself as Andy Vick (DOB: 07/20/64). Andy advised me that his mother in law had stayed at the house the previous night and she saw footprints to the east of that address on the driveway back to his neighbor's residence at 13401 West 58 Avenue. Andy further stated his mother in law stated the footprints appeared to go south along the side of the residence and appeared to end up on 58 Avenue. Andy stated his mother in law had no further information.

I proceeded to check the residence directly south of that location, which was 13480 West 58 Avenue. I was unable to contact anyone at that residence and I was also unable to observe any footprints or anything else suspicious in that front yard.

I then proceeded to 5906 Braun Way in an attempt to contact the home owner to see if there were any footprints in that back yard that went to 13402 West 58 Avenue. I was able to contact the home owner and I was unable to locate any footprints in that backyard, nor was I able to locate any footprints around the area that went to the fence and tree where the footprints had began.

I then traveled to 5905 Braun Way. I contacted the home owner who stated they saw nothing and they did not see any footprints. I was also able to contact the home owner at 5916 Braun Way who also stated they saw nothing and did not notice any footprints.

I have no further information regarding this case at this date and time. Please see other officer's reports for further information.

On 12/09/07 at approximately 0029 hours, I (Officer D. Thornton) heard a gunshots call broadcast on the radio. I responded to the area of the call at 12750 West 63rd Avenue, at the Youth with a Mission dorm. When I arrived at approximately 0037hours, I contacted Sgt De Andrea and Ofc Herrlinger on the east side of the building. We contacted two subjects who were hiding in the playground area. It was determined that they were victims and secured inside my patrol car. Sgt DeAndrea and Ofc Herrlinger continued to the west side of the building. I took a position on the outside of the building on the east side and directed responding emergency medical vehicles to the west side parking lot.

At approximately 0045 hours, I was directed to assist with the interior search of the building. I took a position on the south side of the building near the kitchen and dining room areas blocking the exterior door and two interior stairwells. I maintained that position until approximately 0203 hours, when I was instructed to escort the first group of 20 survivors in an RTD bus from the scene to the headquarters by Det VanderVeen. We arrived at approximately 0215 hours. Once on scene I assisted victim/witness with locating additional blankets and moving the subjects to the Anne Campbell room at headquarters. No one reported having any blood or other evidence adhered to them in the first group.

At approximately 0245 hours, after the second and third buses arrived from the scene, three people were identified to have blood on their hands and clothing. The blood was reportedly from the gunshot victims. According to victim Holly Morgan, the suspect had not shed blood inside the scene. All of the blood on her and in the hallway of the dorms had come from the gunshot victims. I obtained swabs from Morgan, and two other residents. The swabs were then packaged and secured in the APD Lab. At the direction of APD lab technician John Graham, I did not sieze clothing from Morgan.

I then returned to the scene where I maintained a perimeter position at approximately 0430 hours, and was relieved at approximately 0530 from the perimeter duties by a graveyard shift car. I then returned to headquarters until released at 0730.

On 12/09/07 at approximately 0029 hours I, Officer Laas, of the Arvada Police Department overheard the tone for a shots fired at 12750 West 63rd Avenue, at the Youth with a Mission dorm. At this time I then advised Arvada Police Department Dispatch that I would be en route to this location. As I was then coming into the area I was then advised that they needed assistance at the backdoor of this location, or the south side of this residence. Upon arrival into the area, I then did go to the south side of this location, as it was undetermined at this time as to whether the shooter was possibly still inside, and how many other victims were also inside this location. Upon arrival to this backdoor, which was again the south side of this location, I had then gone inside and did observe Sergeant DeAndrea with a white female, later identified as Tiffany Johnson. Sergeant DeAndrea was attempting to carry her out, at which time I then assisted him by grabbing her legs to help carry her out. At this time I did observe there to be blood on the stomach area of this white female. She was then carried out by myself and Sergeant DeAndrea to the Pridemark Paramedics unit, which was parked in the south parking lot, just south of this rear door, where I made entrance, and had first observed Sergeant DeAndrea with this female.

After we had carried Tiffany Johnson to the pram, I had then moved further down the corridor and had observed a white male, later identified as Phillip Crouse, laying on the ground being attended to by an unknown party. At this time Sergeant DeAndrea was then coming to remove this party for medical attention outside. I was then informed by Sergeant DeAndrea to attempt to locate the start of a track for the suspect, as it was believed that he had fled this location. It was discovered that we were still unsure as to whether the shooter was inside; however, several witnesses had stated that he had been chased outside.

I had then gone to the rear south door where I gained entrance and spoke to another victim, a Daniel Griebnow. At this time Mr. Griebnow was by the backdoor and he advised that he had also been shot, and I did observe him to have blood on him as well. Next to Mr. Griebnow was a white female, and at this time I then asked both parties the direction of travel of the shooter. They both advised me that the person had gone possibly west out the backdoor, but they were unsure. The female, who I was unable to identify, had informed me that one of the residents advised that the shooter, who they did not know, had possibly gone to the Safeway or King Soopers, but Mr. Griebnow had informed me again that he thought that this person had gone possibly west or south towards the lake. The description was then given at this time of a white male, wearing some sort of hat, and blue jeans, and a dark colored coat.

After haven been given this information, I had then gone outside with my K-9 dog, Body, to attempt to locate a track of the suspect. I had also advised Officer Avila of the Arvada Police Department of the situation, and we would both attempt to locate a track of the suspect from the back of the residence. I had informed Officer Avila that I would use K-9 Body to the south and west of this location, towards the pond, and then going to the west area to locate any possible fresh odor or track for Body to attempt to track. Officer Avila was advised of this, and he informed me that he would attempt to go to the east side, and would attempt to locate any odor at this location. After haven given K-9 Body his command to track, we had then began to search along the south side of the church, and K-9 Body did locate an odor on the sidewalk leading from the church, and then on the sidewalk along Meadow Lake, going to the west. K-9 Body then did follow this track to the immediate west, where there was a cul-de-sac, and this track had then led north from this cul-de-sac. This track, which I was able to observe in the snow, Body did continue to track north, going across 63rd Avenue and into the duplexes of 63rd Circle. K-9 Body then did specifically track to 13010 West 63rd Avenue, and had circled around the duplex A. After Body had then had this track, I was able to again see the same track that I had observed when we had began the track, just west of the church on the cul-de-sac. This was a smaller track, and it then did continue going west on 63rd Circle,

and we had then gone north on Zang Court. The track had then gone west on 63rd Circle before going back on 63rd Circle, and then we had continued on Zang Court. This track/trail had then gone east on 63rd Place, and was then lost in the area of 63rd Place and Yank Court. I then had Body cast around in an attempt to relocate this track/trail, and had been unable to do so. We then began to check the residence at this location, where the track was lost, to see if we could locate this person; however, I did not observe the tracks in the snow after losing the track in this location, or observe any tracks in this area of the snow, indicating where this person may have gone.

After this track was then lost I overheard Officer Avila, with K-9 Matzo, apparently on a fresh track going south from Meadow Lake, and the possible suspect was fleeing them, possibly going west. After having received this information, I had then gone to the area of 60th and Yank Way, after one of the reports by a citizen of a person matching this description having fled west on 60th from this area. I had then taken K-9 Body after having listening to the track and had gone to the area of West 62nd Drive and Alkire Court, where I did observe more footprints in the snow to the west of this location in an open field. I then allowed Body to attempt to locate any fresh odor in this area, and conducted an area check without locating any further persons. It should be noted on the time of the track in the area search, no items of evidentiary value were located.

At approximately 0029 hours on December 9th, 2007, I (Officer R. Avila) and K-9 Matzo were on patrol in approximately the 6200 block of Depew Street. Arvada Police Dispatch advised that they had received several calls in reference to gunshots at the Youth with a Mission dorm, located at 12750 West 63rd Avenue. Prior to arrival, Arvada Police Dispatch further advised that someone had been shot in the leg. Arvada Police Dispatch advised that the suspect was wearing a dark colored beanie, black coat and possibly had a moustache.

I responded to the location of the call in order to provide assistance via K-9 Matzo. Upon arrival at approximately 0041 hours, I heard officers arranging for the extrication of several individuals within the building who had been shot. I parked my patrol vehicle at the intersection of West 63rd Avenue and Yank Way. It is to be noted that this location was approximately 50 yards to the southwest of the Youth of the Mission dorms. While at this location I observed a light colored older style van, containing approximately five juveniles. I ordered the occupants of the vehicle out of the van. The occupants advised that they had just left a friends house. I verified that the occupants of the vehicle were not involved in the incident, as they did not match a description which had been previously aired by the Arvada Police Department. I stopped a small sedan style vehicle and the driver advised that he was the director of Youth with a Mission. I requested that he leave the area immediately and respond to the Safeway parking lot.

I heard officers within the building request that Pridemark Paramedics respond to remove some of the wounded parties inside. I allowed one Pridemark ambulance to enter into the area. I remained with my vehicle at the intersection of West 63rd Avenue and Yank Way. It is to be noted that I did not observe any subjects walking within this area at this time.

At approximately 0057 hours, I was contacted by Officer Laas, who requested that I meet him on the east side of the building in an attempt to perform a track/trail in the area. It is to be noted that Officer Laas advised me that per his interview of witnesses, that he was unable to determine a start for the track in which the suspect had fled. It is to be noted that it currently had been snowing and there was approximately 3 to 4 inches of fresh snow on the ground.

At approximately 0102 hours on 12/09/2007, I deployed K-9 Matzo in an attempt to locate the shooting suspect. I attempted a track/trail from the east end of the building. I requested that a Jefferson County Sheriff's unit assist me in reference to the track/trail, as the subject we were looking for was currently armed and had already shot and wounded several people on scene. It is to be noted that officers advised that the subject was a white male last seen running south across the lake (Meadow Lake). Deputy Enrico Galimberti of the Jefferson County Sheriff Department responded to my area and served as my cover officer during my search for the suspect.

I searched the area of the baseball field, which is located to the west of Faith Christian Bible Chapel. While in this area, I observed an entrance way onto 62nd Avenue from the area of the lake. I loudly announced "Police Department, Police trained dog. Show yourself now or I will release the dog and the dog will bite" three times. I did not receive a response from anyone in the area. I walked with Matzo to the area of the entrance to W. 62nd Ave. Upon reaching this area, I observed several footprints traveling in an eastward direction. The footprints were separated apart by approximately four feet. It is to be noted that I believed that the subject that had left these footprints was currently running based on their wide distance apart. I observed an aggressive style tread on the imprint into the snow. I also observed that the footprints were slightly iced over. I noted the distinct aggressive tread marks of this shoe. I gave

K9 Matzo the command to track. Matzo immediately put his nose into the footprints and pulled in an easterly direction. I followed the track eastbound along the foot trail connecting Meadow Lake Park and West 62nd Avenue. Matzo continued to pull along the visible footprints in the snow. Upon reaching the intersection of West 62nd Avenue, these footprints turned onto southbound Xenon Street. I allowed K-9 Matzo to cast and to locate the footprints on his own. K-9 Matzo did locate a fresh odor, as Matzo was pulling in such a manner to indicate he was on a strong track/trail. On this set of tracks, which were visible within the snow, Matzo continued to pull strongly in a southern direction. This lined up with the footprints that I could observe on the west end the street. The footprints in the snow appeared to be from the same shoe that I observed at the start of the track. K-9 Matzo continued to pull southbound on Xenon Street. K-9 Matzo stopped at the intersection of West 60th Avenue and Xenon Street. K-9 Matzo made a west turn onto West 60th Avenue. While on West 60th Avenue, K-9 Matzo pulled in a western direction until reaching 12731 West 60th Avenue. K9 Matzo tracked/trailed the footprints into the backyard. The Track continued until they reached a 4 foot chain link and wood fence. K9 Matzo jumped over the fence and continued into the backyard of 12751 West 60th Avenue. I observed that the footprints turned to the North and exited the yard. I observed a male subject peer out of the bedroom window. The subject asked who I was, and I advised I was the Arvada Police Department. I asked the male if he had seen anybody else come through his yard. The male stated that he had not. I jumped over a retaining wall, located on the north portion of this residence, and continued westbound onto Youngfield Street. The tracks continued in a westbound direction into the backyard of 12821 West 60th Avenue. The tracks that I observed in the snow were of what appeared to be the same shoeprint that I observed at the start of the track.

I observed that the footprints traveled in a westerly direction towards the west fence of the yard. Upon reaching the west side of the residence, the footprints turned in a southern direction for approximately 10 yards. It appeared as though the subject had stopped within the backyard at a location in which the subject could see to the east and west along West 60th Avenue. The footprints then turned towards the residence and approached the backdoor of the residence. I observed what appeared to be a nearly perfect impression of a footprint within the snow on the cement portion of the back porch. The sliding screen door was currently open, and the glass door leading into the residence was closed. I observed that the tracks then went east out of the backyard and onto northbound Youngfield Street. K-9 Matzo continued to track/trail along the visible prints. K-9 Matzo and I followed these tracks northbound on Youngfield Street. Upon reaching the intersection of West 61st Avenue, the tracks turned to the west, and continued west. The tracks continued to the dead end portion of the road of West 61st Avenue. The tracks then crossed through an open area into the backyard of 12972 West 61st Circle. Upon following these tracks I exited onto West 61st Circle, at which time the tracks turned to the south and continued along West 61st Circle. These tracks appeared to be consistent with the initial tracks that I had observed earlier. Upon reaching the area of West 61st Circle and Zinnia Street, I was accompanied by Sergeant DeAndrea and members of the Jefferson County Sheriff's Department in finishing the route of the track.

I followed the tracks along the east sidewalk towards the west entrance to Meadow Lake Park. Upon reaching the northwest sidewalk of the Meadow Lake Park, I lost a visual of the tracks that I had been following, in approximately the area of 62nd Avenue and Xenon Street. K-9 Matzo continued to track/trail into Meadow Lake Park; however, it is to be noted that there were several footprints within the snow at this time, and that K-9 Matzo was not indicating that he was on a strong odor, by not staying dedicated to a single track. At this time I continued to track as K-9 Matzo pulled along the south portion of Meadow Lake, at which time we arrived in the initial area that we had located the footprints. At approximately 0210 hours, I advised Arvada Police Dispatch that I no longer was going to be actively tracking this

subject, as I did not have a viable track at this time. I advised Arvada Police Dispatch that I would be responding back to my marked patrol unit.

At approximately 0244 hours, I responded to 12821 West 60th Avenue, along with Deputy Galimberti of the Jefferson County Sheriff's Department. I knocked on the front door of the residence. A female called out from inside "who is it?" I advised that I was with the Arvada Police Department. The door opened and I contacted Faith Anderson (DOB: 07/19/43), Betsy Ray (DOB: 10/31/62) and Sara Ray (DOB: 11/10/81). Betsy advised that she was the owner of the residence. It is to be noted that all three female subjects were currently wearing bathrobes and appeared to be shaken up. Betsy advised that they had just received a "reverse 911 call" about the shooting. I asked if anyone had heard anything outside of their residence and Faith stated that she saw a flashlight earlier in the night. I advised Faith that I believed that it was when I had cleared the backyard of the residence. I advised the women that I located a footprint within their backyard while on an earlier track/trail.

I asked if Faith would take me down into their basement area, which was the location of the door that I had observed from outside of the residence. Faith took me to the door and stated that the sliding screen door portion would normally be shut. The glass door, containing a brass colored handle, was currently shut and locked. I asked the other women if they knew if it was locked, and Sara stated, "We usually shut the screen door." They stated, "I'm almost certain the screen door was shut." Faith advised that nobody in her residence had been in the backyard during the snowstorm that had occurred. Faith stated, "I shoveled the front portion of the house sometime between 8:30 and 9:00 p.m." Sara advised, "We went to bed between 11:15 and 11:30." Faith stated that nobody should have been in their backyard during the night.

At approximately 0304 hours, Betsy advised that she currently was the owner of the residence, and that the police department had permission to process her backyard, as well as the inside of her residence. I notified Sergeant Strasheim and Detective Bob Vander Veen of the location of the footprint and requested to have a member of the Arvada Police Department Crime Lab respond in order to process the footprint.

At approximately 0315 hours, I was contacted by Lab Technician Mike Reid of the Arvada Police Department Crime Lab. I advised Technician Reid of the location of the footprint. At approximately 0345 hours, Technician John Graham, as well as Technician Reid arrived on scene in order to process the footprint that I had observed.

At approximately 0448 hours, I responded to the area of 61st and Xenon Street in order to describe to Sergeant DeAndrea what I had observed in this area. Several members of the Arvada Police Department, as well as the Jefferson County Sheriff's Department, accompanied me as we attempted to retrace the track in the snow. I responded to the residence located at 12821 West 60th Avenue and showed Sergeant DeAndrea the location of the footprints that I had found. We did not attempt to follow the track any further.

At approximately 0727 hours, Sergeant DeAndrea of the Arvada Police Department requested that I rewalk the route, along with K-9 Matzo, in order to see if we could locate any evidence. At approximately 0742 hours, K-9 Matzo and I, along with Officer Hirsch, walked the route of the track in an attempt to locate any evidence. It is to be noted that I did not locate any apparent evidence within reference to this matter.

That is the extent of my involvement in this case. I will not be conducting any further investigation. For further information please refer to other officers' reports.

On Sunday, 12/09/07, Officer Tony Lima was contacted by Sergeant Sheehan. Sergeant Sheehan requested Officer Lima assist Criminalist John Graham in processing a double homicide scene at 12750 West 63 Ave, which was the Youth With A Mission dormitories. Sergeant Sheehan informed Officer Lima that Criminalist Mike Reid had to leave the scene and requested Officer Lima assist Criminalist Graham in the continued processing of the crime scene. Sergeant Sheehan informed Officer Lima that he was to report to the crime scene at approximately 1400 hours.

At approximately 1411 hours, Officer Lima arrived at the crime scene. Officer Lima met with Sergeant Luby, who was keeping the crime scene entry log. At approximately 1415 hours, Officer Lima entered the crime scene. Officer Lima met with Criminalist Graham, who was inside the crime scene processing the scene. Officer Lima met with Criminalist Graham at a door that went into the dormitories, which was positioned at the south side of the building. Criminalist Graham pointed to an area of juniper bushes that were located at the east side of the concrete sidewalk that led to the door. Criminalist Graham informed Officer Lima that Criminalist Reid had already cut back the juniper bushes and searched for casings. Criminalist Reid located nine (9) .9mm casings thus far. Criminalist Graham requested Officer Lima search the remainder of the area of the juniper bushes in an attempt to locate additional casings.

Officer Lima put on latex gloves and began sifting through the shrubbery debris in the bushes and the snow in an attempt to search for the casings. Officer Lima grabbed a handful at a time of the debris and place it on the sidewalk, and sift through that debris using Officer Lima's hands. At approximately 1445 hours, Officer Lima located a brass-colored .9mm R.P. Luger casing in the shrubbery. The casing was located at the intersection of two railroad ties that surrounded the bushes. The area where the casing was located was east of the eastern side of the sidewalk that led to the door. Officer Lima located the casing by sifting through the debris and did not locate the casing where it was originally positioned. Officer Lima contacted Criminalist Graham, advising him that a casing had been located. Criminalist Graham came and took photographs of the casing, collected the casing as evidence, and secured it in an evidence container.

At approximately 1500 hours, Officer Lima located a brass-colored .9mm R.P. Luger casing in the same area of shrubbery at the east side of the walkway. Officer Lima again contacted Criminalist Graham, who took photographs of the casing. Criminalist Graham and Officer Lima took measurements of that casing, due to the fact that Officer Lima located that casing where it was originally positioned and had not moved the casing. It was approximately 2'10" south of the south side of the building wall and approximately 10" east of the east edge of the walkway. Once the casing was measured, Criminalist Graham secured the casing in the evidence container.

At approximately 1530 hours, Officer Lima located a brass-colored .9mm WIN Luger casing from the same area of bushes. Officer Lima obtained a handful of debris from the bushes and while sifting through that debris, located the casing. Criminalist Graham took photographs of the casing and then collected the casing as evidence.

At approximately 1540 hours, Officer Lima located a brass-colored .9mm R.P. Luger casing, which was discovered in a handful of debris from the same area of bushes. Criminalist Graham took photographs of the casing and then collected the casing as evidence.

At approximately 1545 hours, Officer Lima located a brass-colored .9mm R.P. Luger casing while sifting through debris from the same area of bushes. Criminalist Graham took photographs of the casing, and then

collected the casing as evidence.

At approximately 1615 hours, Officer Lima located a brass-colored .9mm WIN casing from debris Officer Lima sifted through from the same area of bushes. Criminalist Graham took photographs of the casing and then collected the casing as evidence.

At approximately 1700 hours, Criminalist Graham informed Officer Lima that the search could be concluded for that date. Criminalist Graham stated he would hold the scene overnight and come back on the next day to continuing processing the scene. Officer Lima informed Criminalist Graham there was one area of the shrubs, south of where Officer Lima searched, that still needed to be searched. Criminalist Graham stated that would be done on the next day, along with using a metal detector to search that area. Officer Lima assisted Criminalist Graham in securing some of his crime scene processing equipment inside his vehicle, and Officer Lima left the crime scene at approximately 1715 hours. All items of evidence were left in the custody of Criminalist Graham.
